### CONDITIONS

Entries will only be accepted if accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope or the inclusion of 70 cents to cover the return of entry tickets.

All entries are to be hand delivered or posted and accompanied by appropriate fees

All exhibits in this section MUST be delivered to the Showground between the hours of 10 am and 3.30 pm on Saturday 24th September 2011

As this condition will be strictly enforced, Exhibitors living at a distance are advised to see that their exhibits are posted or consigned early. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m. Monday 26th September 2011.

**No exhibitor shall remove their entries from the show cases unless they are accompanied by the steward, THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED**

1. All exhibits in this section must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor and completed within the last two years.
2. Exhibits that have previously taken a prize at a Wagga Show shall not be eligible to compete.
3. All exhibits shall be inspected by a Selection Committee appointed by the Society. Cleanliness is essential. The Committee shall have the power to withhold any exhibit being brought before the judges.
4. An exhibit shall not receive an award if, in the opinion of the Judge, it is unworthy of such award. The decision of the Judge is final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into.
5. Entries that are original designs should have certification of such, by the entrants attached.
6. No entry made in one class can be entered into another class.
7. The printed declaration enclosed with exhibitor tickets must be signed by the exhibitor and then stuck onto the back of the exhibit ticket. The declaration reads "I declare that the whole of the work in this exhibit is original and was executed by me".
8. The committee shall exercise every care with work submitted but will not be responsible for loss, any damage or breakage of any exhibit while in their custody nor for insurance of exhibits either in transit or while on exhibition.
9. In Children's Sections exhibitors shall not be over the age named in each class in which they intend to exhibit at date of closing of entries.
10. All schoolwork entries must have name of exhibitor and school clearly marked on entry form and back of article.
11. All conditions will be strictly enforced.
12. **No entries or prize money or vouchers will be available for collection prior to Saturday 1st October 2011.**
13. Exhibits and Prize money may be collected from Hammond Hall between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon.

**(Competition to be conducted at Society, Group and State Level).**

### **Three Different Types of Wool Articles and/or Garments**

Articles and Garments may be knitted, crocheted or constructed in wool fabric or raw wool. **(Minimum wool content 80%)**

#### **CONDITIONS:**

1. An exhibitor in this competition may be one individual or a group of individuals or an organization.
2. All three articles/garments must have been made within twelve months of the Local Show and made by the Exhibitor/s.
3. An exhibit having won at a Local Show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winner of the Group Final may then be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the RAS State Final (Sydney Show).
4. An exhibit (the same three articles/garments) having won at the Local Show level is not eligible to enter this class At any other show until after Group judging, when, if not being the winning entry, may then compete further.
5. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group Level and one Group at State Level.
6. An exhibitor having won at Group level CANNOT compete further until after the Royal Show.
7. **Sample of wool and/or label to be attached.**

N.B. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a particular show, the Show Secretary (or delegate) may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group Judging as an exhibit representing the particular society concerned.
